History of SonBridge

SonBridge Center for Better Living was founded in 2004 by Walla Walla Valley Seventh-day Adventists who recognized the importance of direct access to low-cost community services for people.

In 2005, sponsored by eight local congregations, SonBridge purchased a vacant nursing home in College Place, Washington, adjacent to the Walla Walla city limits.

In 2013, the SonBridge Dental Clinic opened, providing dental care for community residents. Many smiles have been restored and much pain relieved as patients are treated with care, dignity and respect.

In 2017, an additional 5,000 square feet was added and named the SonBridge Education Center. The new education center triples SonBridge's meeting space and has expanded our capacity to serve people in the Walla Walla Valley.

SonBridge has expanded to provide financial assistance, hosting support groups, and operating a thrift store that continues to impact the lives of our friends and neighbors.

Through SonBridge's services, we endeavor to bring positive change to everyone who walks through our doors.

Mission

Bringing Hope and Wholeness to the people of the Walla Walla Valley.

Vision

To build a community where God's unconditional love is expressed through resources and services to revitalize the whole person.

Approach

SonBridge serves anyone who needs help without regard to race, gender, religious belief or affiliation. We seek to identify unmet needs within our community and strive to fill the gaps. When we cannot meet the needs, we partner with other agencies who can provide those services.

Community Connection & Advisory Council

SonBridge coordinates with more than 10 community organizations to listen and learn, to better serve the community by sharing information and connecting resources.

Year in Review

NORMAN THIEL, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

To me, the metaphor for the year 2022 that is strongest is wading into a rushing river. This metaphorical river is our community in the midst of significant and turbulent change. This change is downriver from the dramatic changes of the prior two pandemic-driven years. Yet as we entered the waters of this year, we didn't know how fast it was flowing nor what lay ahead around the bend.

The significant needs of our community continued to be expressed through participation in Better Living support groups and programs. We had our highest year ever with over 33,000 visits. This was led by participation in Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) and Narcotics Anonymous (NA) groups. An area that returned to vitality this year was an exercise program for seniors that picked up where it left off in early 2020 and now has doubled in size.

The dental clinic continues to serve community residents, while suffering from a lack of staff similar to many other healthcare organizations. We replaced flooring and two of our chairs after nine years of operation and we transitioned to a more powerful practice management software to meet the changing environment.

We've ironed out the wrinkles in our volunteer management software and have new tools to track our volunteers tireless work as well as communicate with them more effectively. We actively used the new facility scheduling software to reserve and identify each room for intended purpose during this peak year.

We continued to assist families in unique ways, especially with clothing, household goods, and small cash amounts. Larger needs for utilities and rent assistance continued to be met by government funding reserves from our partners.

With the encouragement of the City of College Place, we launched a new area of service by creating a series of day camps for middle-school aged youth. We started small, yet gained momentum and participation as word of mouth did wonderful marketing for us.

SonBridge concluded the year by connecting more lives and empowering more change than any previous year. We thank you, our supporters, and our community for your amazing generosity this year. We praise our Heavenly Father for His care, guidance, and blessing.



David's Journey

David Hernandez first came into SonBridge in the summer of 2022 to attend an Alcoholics Anonymous (AA) meeting. A veteran who had recently moved to the area, he was in desperate need of a change in his life.



David grew up in El Paso, Texas in an Hispanic family. He served in the military as a medic. After he retired, he trained and worked as a nurse before attending school to become a physician's assistant. He was a bright student and successful in what he did. "People respected me," he said. "They came to me for advice and help."

Then David's life took a steep downturn. In the scope of one year, David suffered a series of serious health challenges; heart failure, a pulmonary embolism, and temporary loss of sight due to a retinal problem. During this time, David's wife left him. He took refuge in alcohol and drugs to combat his physical and emotional suffering. Over the next two years, his health conditions improved, but his dependence on substances worsened. His physician's assistant license was taken away, causing him to spiral deeper into a destructive cycle.

David knew he needed help. He reached out to the Veterans Administration (VA) in Washington state. He wanted to go to Seattle, but the VA encouraged him otherwise. "In Seattle you won't get the help

you need," the VA worker told him. "You'll just be a number. You should go to Walla Walla instead."

David had no idea where Walla Walla was, but he was willing to give it a try. He received help from the VA, by completing an intensive rehabilitation course to get clean and moving into transitional housing through the Corps of Recovery and Discovery, (C.O.R.D.) program for veterans.

Now David is turning his life around. He rides around town on a bicycle and has a part-time job. SonBridge has been an important place for him during his recovery. He attends several recovery meetings a week, through Alcoholics Anonymous and Recovery Militia. At times, he comes to SonBridge just to sit in a quiet, unoccupied spot and attend online appointments. "There's no place like SonBridge," David shares. "This place does so



much for the community and a lot of people don't even know everything that goes on here."

At SonBridge, our mission is to help David and people like him to find hope and wholeness on their journeys.



Jennifer's Miracle

Jennifer Austin walked into SonBridge one July morning in 2019. She had come from Tri-Cities, fleeing an abusive relationship that had threatened to claim her life. When she'd requested help from a local shelter, she was told that as a single woman there wasn't a place for her in any of the Tri-Cities locations. She had to either go to Wenatchee or Walla Walla. So she packed up her car and came to the YWCA in Walla Walla.

Jennifer moved through the YWCA quickly. After 30 days in the women's shelter, she moved into an apartment with another woman. Through agencies like Helpline and Blue Mountain Action Council (BMAC), Jennifer was referred to SonBridge. The front-desk workers and administrators at SonBridge gave her everything she needed to fill her apartment – clothing, furniture, even helping her stuff a mattress into her car!

As Jennifer's life was turning around, she felt the need to give back to the community. In October of 2020, she was driving down Myra Road in College Place when she had the urge to turn towards SonBridge. There she requested to volunteer, putting in 120 hours a month for more than a year. She even learned that a friend of hers from Tri-Cities had a sister-in-law who volunteered at SonBridge!

"The Lord was preparing a family for me way in advance." She said. "My heart was being worked on before I ever got here."

After volunteering almost full-time for more than a year, Jennifer was hired to work at SonBridge. A friend began

to take her to church, and soon after she was baptized by the SonBridge chaplain, Pastor Steve Chinn, in January 2022. Now not only is she active at SonBridge, but she also gives her time and talents in the beginners classroom at her home church.

Jennifer is widely known as a "SonBridge Ambassador". She artfully styles and wears clothes from the thrift store and encourages people to give to the organization. "SonBridge gave me what I most needed – a place to feel loved and accepted, a safe space. As I worked through the trauma I'd lived through, I could work off the restlessness and worry here. SonBridge is a beautiful place, where people can come for help without being embarrassed or worried."

"I'm so happy to work in a place that gives with open arms and is so in-tune with the needs of the community," she added. "Working here creates a ripple effect– it's not just a job or a task, but a way to bless people far along the line."

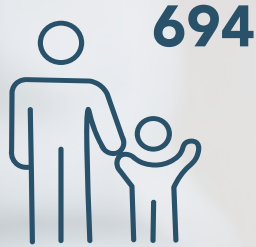

Jennifer is a living example of the power of God's love and community support. She also embodies SonBridge's heart of mission, giving back generously to those around her to bring hope and wholeness.

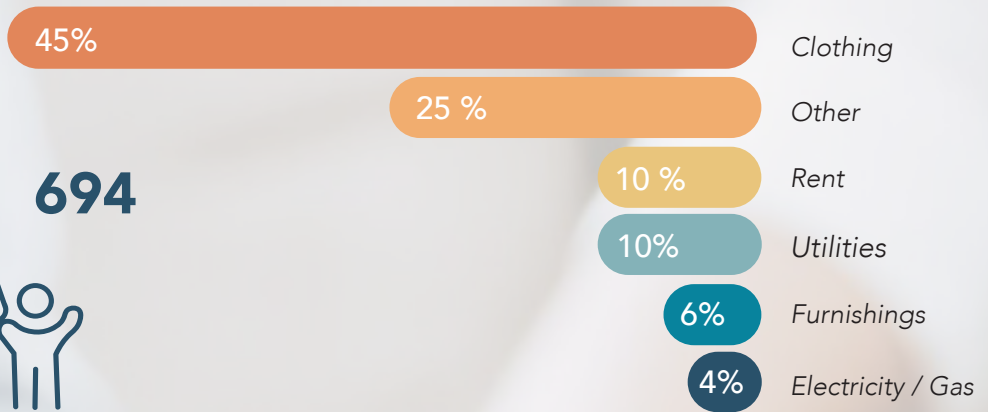

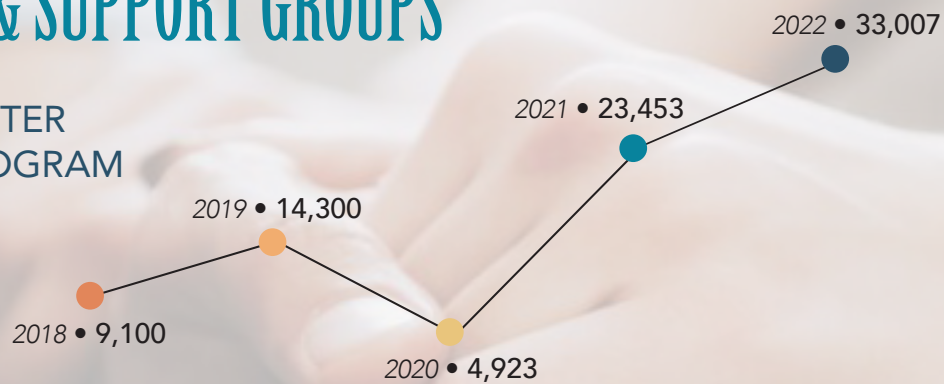

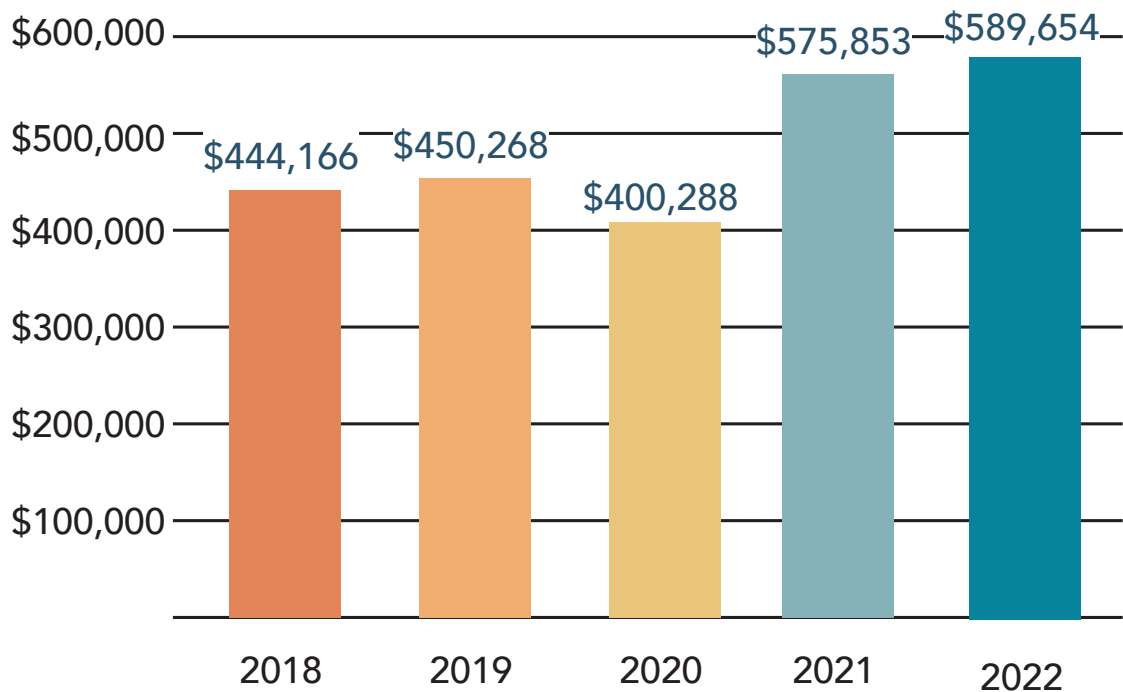

Dental Clinic Update

LORINDA SHELDEN, DENTAL CLINIC MANAGER

The SonBridge Dental Clinic always seems to personify “when you are in the service of your fellow beings, you are in the service of our God.” **Willingness** is the key to helping others. Remembering that all teeth walking into our clinic with a person attached to them is paramount.

Attributes of technical excellence and multiple certificates of demonstrated knowledge hanging on the wall merits little admiration from our patients, if not accompanied with kindness, respect, patience and empathy. Allow me to explain.

Respect comes as a patient feels listened to, that their particular situation is worthy of our time. Kindness is most often shown when we do what it takes to recognize this patient’s individuality...an extra pillow for their neck, a towel to support their knee, a blanket to add some warmth for their visit, or an encouraging word that the pain will soon be relieved. Comfort is just a different way to spell kindness, and kindness flows into patience.



Patience involves listening, educating, allowing moments of “wait just a second,” and “I need a little break”. Patience grows into trust. Trust is difficult to establish when mouth pain and fear are involved.

Remembering always Who we represent when serving others and asking His help to accomplish the needed treatment of each of our patients, invites the relationship of trust.

To undergo most surgeries, patients must be free of the bacteria associated with decayed teeth. With Heavenly Father’s help, our willingness, and a patients’ trust, we have alleviated these infections and achieved 50+ brand new smiles. We have also prepared patients for several knee, hip and finger joint replacements, helped 6+ patients prepare and get through chemotherapy and dialysis treatments, and emptied at least four laundry baskets of toothaches...and still counting.

So far, we have five dentists who share their talents part-time. We anticipate more part-time dentists and assistants to join us in service. **Willingness** to share our God-given talents, serving with others who recognize the pure joy of unconditional service, is how and why Sonbridge Dental Clinic is continually blessed and will continue to help one person in need at a time.

A Peaceful Store

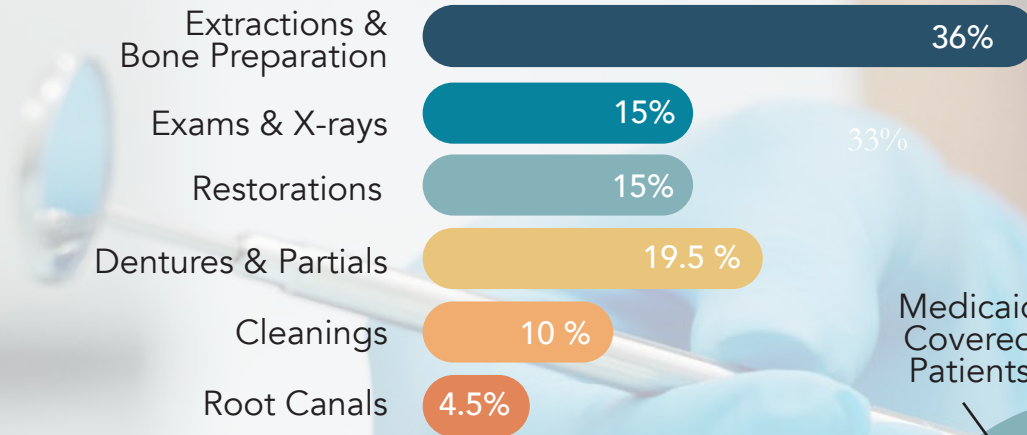

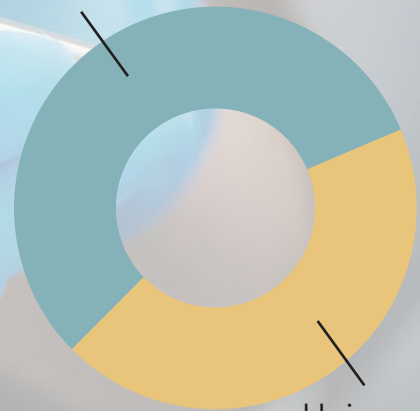
TYPE OF PROCEDURES PERFORMED



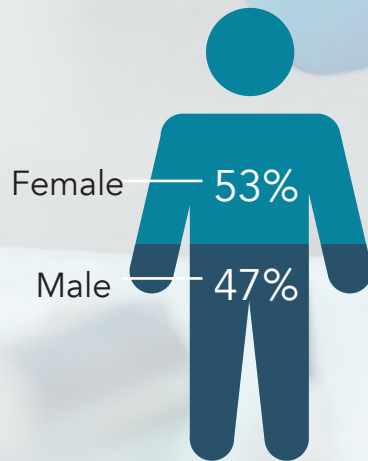

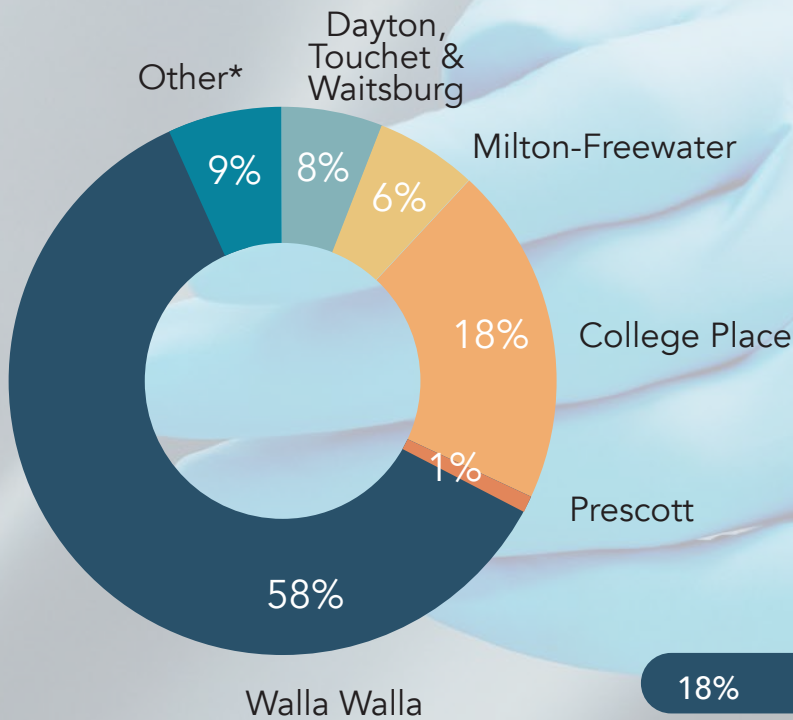

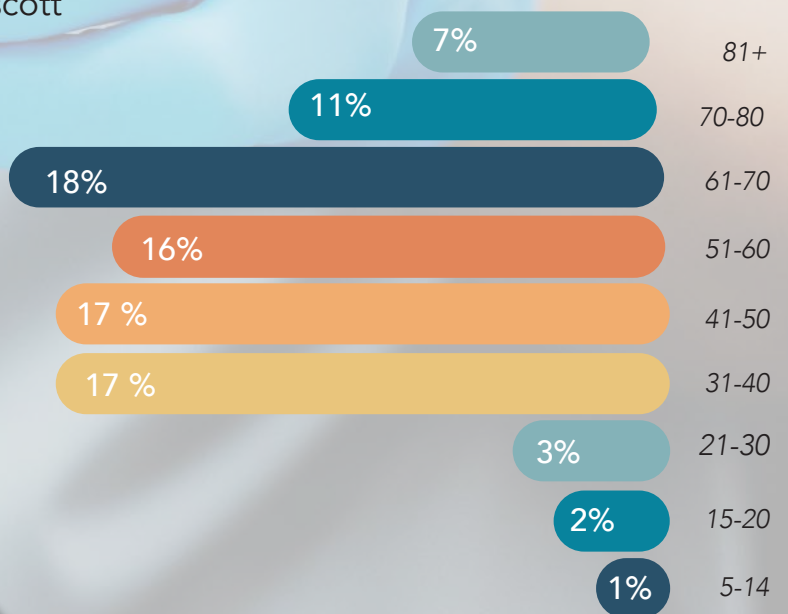

AGE OF PATIENTS

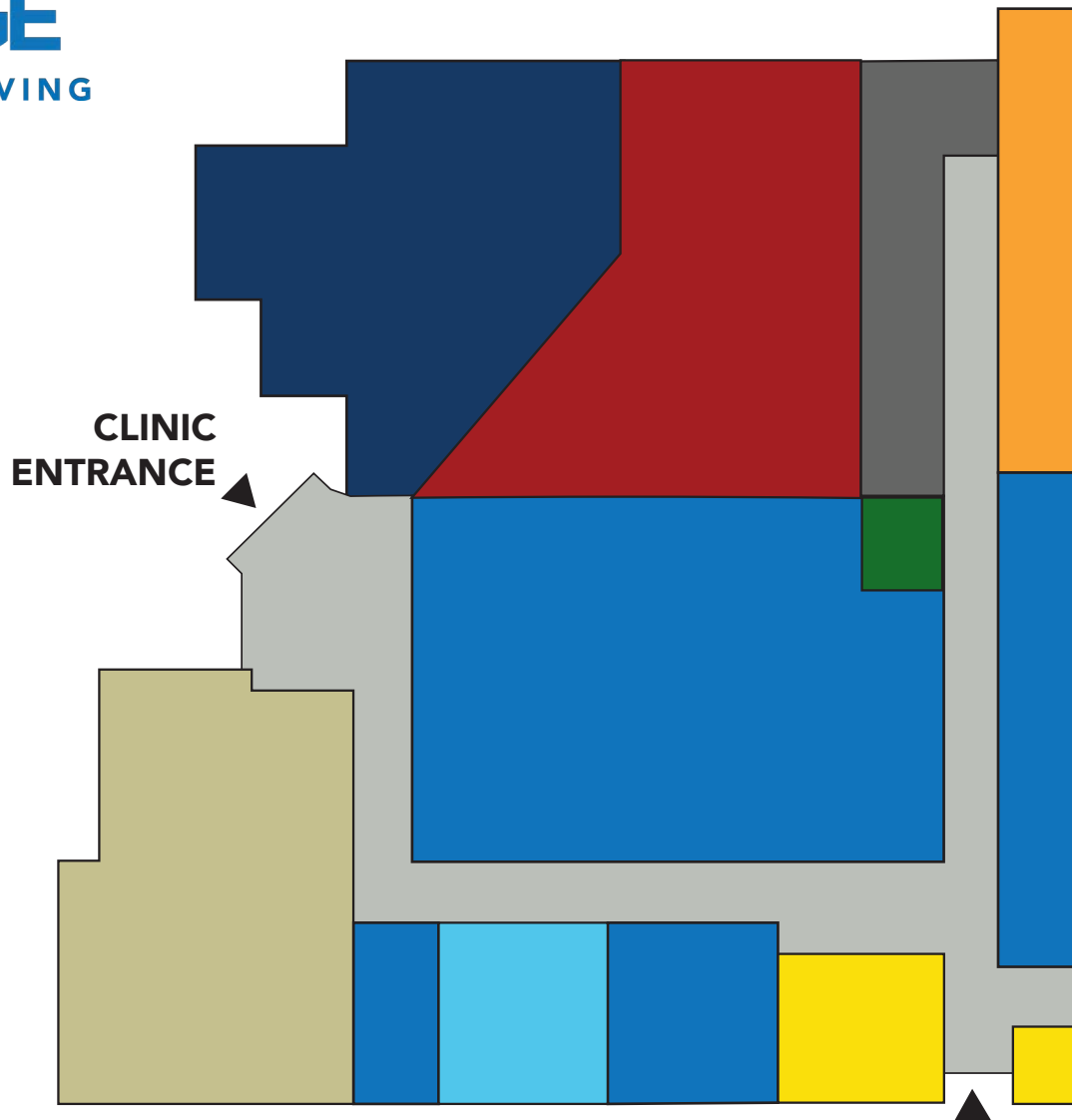

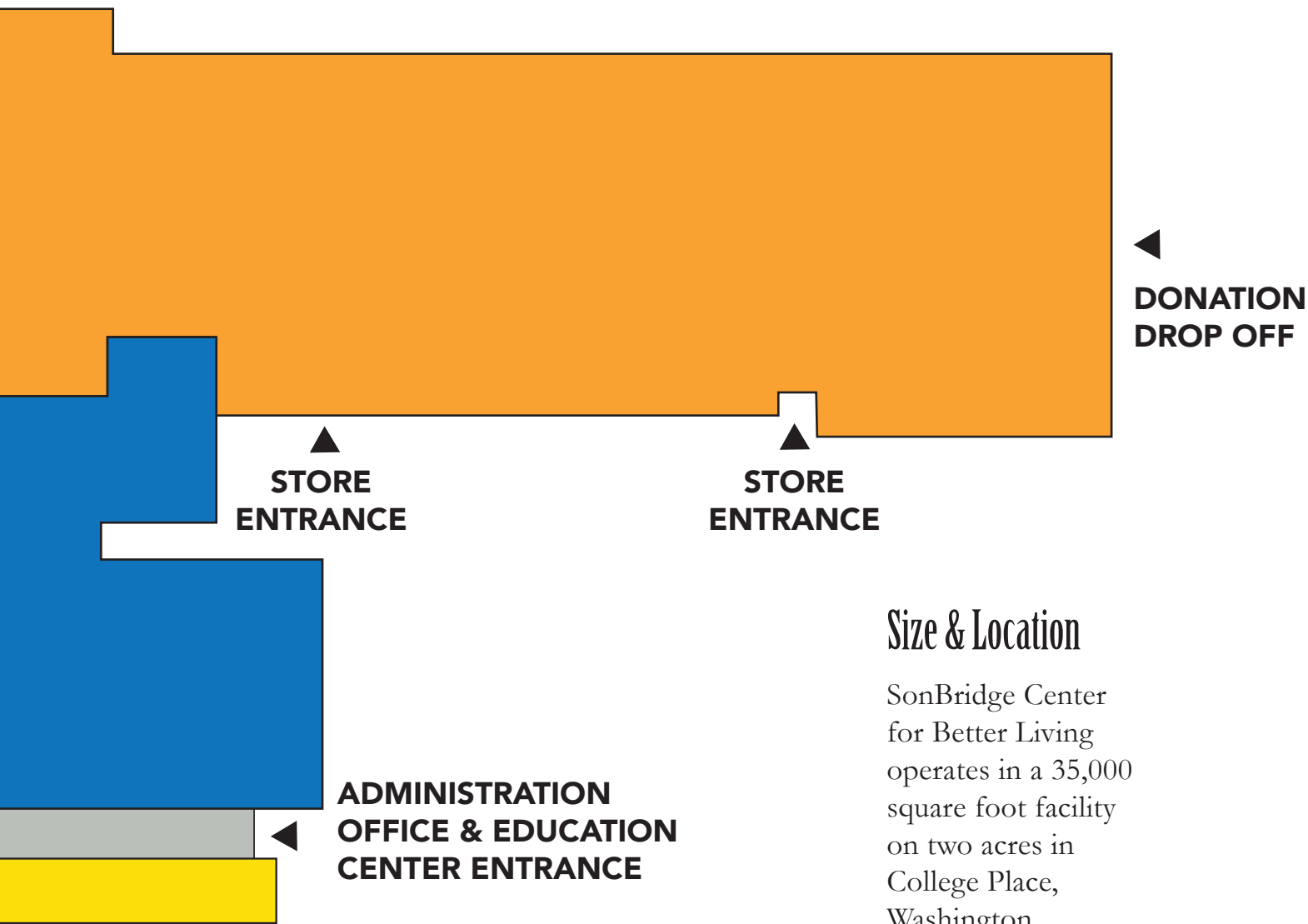

SonBridge Center for Better Living operates in a 35,000 square foot facility on two acres in College Place, Washington.

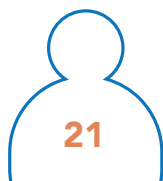

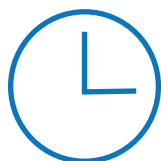

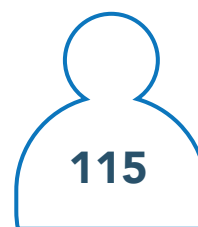

Education & Job Training

From university student internships, to employee training programs, to high school work experience, and community member opportunities, SonBridge Center for Better Living offers a unique place to further education and gain experience.

While sorting and stocking donations in the SonBridge Thrift&Gift Store, performing janitorial services, and preparing and maintaining meeting spaces, high school students learn and grow. Kitty Haney, SonBridge executive assistant, manages the students' work experience. "They learn responsibility and practical skills that transcend the office or the store cash register." she remarked.



SonBridge offers Youth Engagement classes, geared toward youth in middle school and in addition, offers Adult Enrichment classes for social fulfillment and community engagement. "We are planning classes in personal finance and maintenance to teach youth life skills," shared Alex Engels, SonBridge Programs Director. "Classes for adults include support groups

In addition, BMAC uses SonBridge's Education Center meeting rooms to host financial security workshops, life skills and parenting classes, bringing relevant knowledge to many eager learners.

The American Association of Retired Persons (AARP) Senior Community Service Employment (SCSEP) program connects retired individuals with SonBridge to help them reintegrate into the workforce. Kathryn Frost went through the program with a very positive experience. "I can't recommend the AARP SCSEP program enough," she shared. "It's just a stellar program and I'm very thankful for their support." She was offered a position at SonBridge while she was still in training with SCSEP and now works in the administrative office.

2022 INCOME SUMMARY

The Thrift&Gift Store continued to contribute strongly as our community demonstrated their interest for value in clothing, books, and kitchenware. Many other categories completed the other half of the sales.

Sales increased a modest 3% overall with significant sales from online stores on eBay and Poshmark. Revenue from the dental clinic decreased by 23% due to difficulty in hiring adequate staff, although this was partially offset by funding for youth programs.

SonBridge's unrestricted community support decreased by 14% due to the shifting of foundation giving away from pandemic-related support. Restricted giving, primarily for dental care, was very robust.

2022 EXPENSES SUMMARY

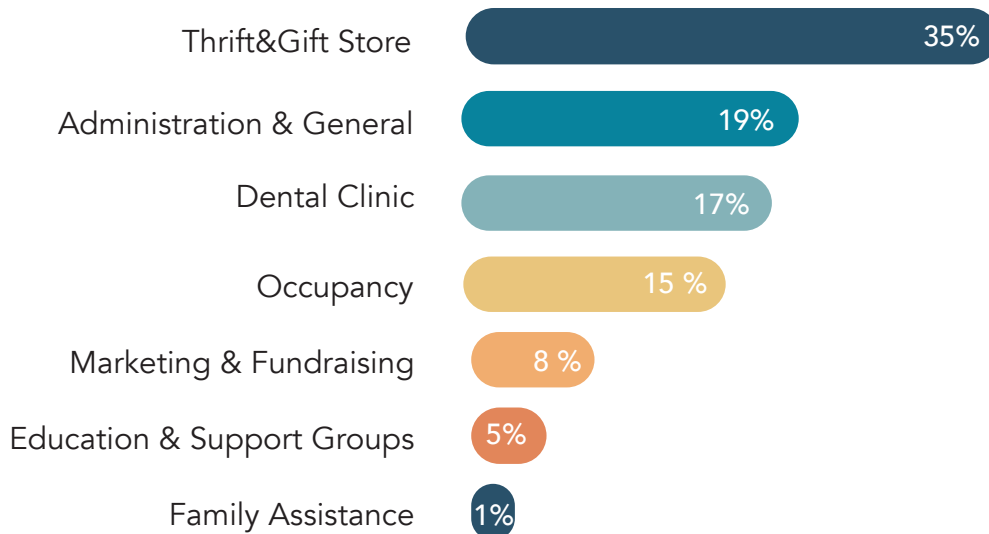
The Thrift&Gift Store is the vital source of income yet requires very significant labor. A large group of volunteers is directed by a dedicated and talented group of staff members which has grown this year.

The SonBridge Dental Clinic relieves pain and restores smiles yet requires a specialized staff that are in high demand, relatively expensive, and often unavailable. Our education department grew rapidly as we responded to the need of College Place and surrounding communities for activity camps for middle-school aged youth. These camps had first-year funding from church programs as well as city funding.

Our Family Assistance services have continued to experience less demand due to extraordinary government programs and funding for utilities, housing, and food. Our meeting rooms that house our highest-ever support group visits have been partially funded by pandemic grants. Unfortunately, these grants were exhausted by end of the year.

Supporting each of these direct services areas were our occupancy and administration departments. Our marketing and fundraising investments complete the expense picture and generate substantial returns.

Development Update

Thank you to the many generous donors who have dropped off items to be sold in the Thrift&Gift Store, given of their time and provided resources for SonBridge to give back to our community.

The year 2022 had water-related challenges as the City of College Place informed us that our water bill was extraordinary. After much prayer and many hours spent searching, a worrisome water leak was found under the parking lot in front of the Thrift&Gift store.

We are so grateful to our friends at PocketiNet Communications for helping us locate and repair this leak. We were given a quote for this emergency repair by another company and PocketiNet charged us less than 1/6 of that price. The leak is now repaired and the concrete and asphalt will be repaired as soon as the ground dries out this summer.

Our focus remains on completing the additions to the dental clinic. The dental office and patient consultation room was completed, roofing was finished and the washer and dryer were installed and are in use.

A concerted effort is underway to address the Thrift&Gift Store space needs. If you have ever volunteered in the store, you know very well that the donation drop-off and processing areas are so crowded that it is difficult to find room to sort, clean and organize all of the donations. The need for more parking is also part of this effort.

God continues to bless by sending people and performing miracles. We thank Him for His goodness, mercy and love.

2023 Goals

1. Increase the sales generated by our Thrift&Gift store over our 2022 mark by 2%.
2. Create a plan for expanding the donation receiving and processing areas.
3. Create a multi-year plan for expanding our parking.
4. Increase the scope and scale of our 2022 Education and Support Groups by 10%.
5. Expand the number of people and procedures we deliver in the SonBridge Dental Clinic.
6. Plan and fund a digital readerboard on 12th Street.
7. Reallocate and reuse BMTV space.
8. Upgrade the administrative office area and entrance.
9. Create Helpline@SonBridge and develop team to deliver service.

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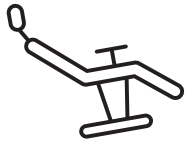

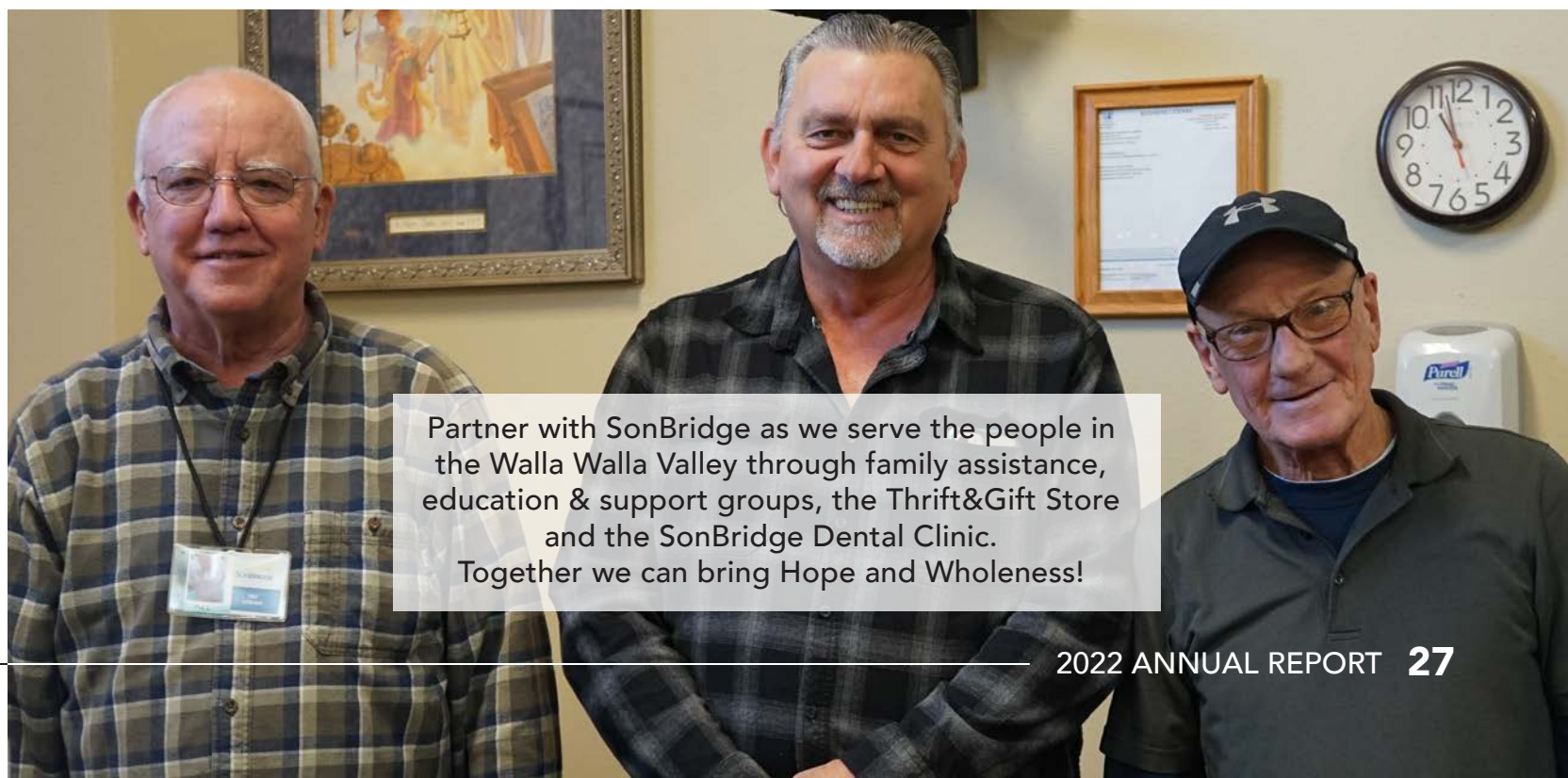
